A HUMBLE OFFERING MADE OVERABUNDANT


Whenever my family went to our grandparents' homes, as was a venerable Sunday afternoon tradition, there was one thing that was always certain: you were going to eat well. It could be a meal of meatloaf, chicken and dumplings, chili, chicken, amongst so many other various offerings, and each one was always prepared in abundance. There was often so much abundance, in fact, that you could go back and snack later if you were still hungry. There was always plenty of food to be had at either place.

Both the first reading and the Gospel deal with stories of what was thought to be a meager amount of bread- an amount that seemed to be too small to feed many people- let alone the amount of people that were present in each account. Yet, when the bread was broken and distributed in both accounts- it was enough! In fact, it was well over enough!

These next few weeks, we are going to be going through John 6 and specifically addressing the Eucharist in our readings. It is a beautiful time of recollection, because we are going to methodically reflect on and renew ourselves as a Eucharistic people. The first offering that we have this week is simple: the Eucharist is something that appears humble, but in fact fills us to overabundance with Christ, and with His grace. The important thing? That we never forget the goodness and importance of the meal. That we show up. That we come hungry and thirsting for our Lord and God!

Whether we are going to a grandparent's house- or to the Lord's Supper in the Eucharistmay we never forget that we are going to be fed something humble- which will truly fill us in a way nothing else can. Perhaps there will even be some left overs for us of food- and of grace!


