MEDICINE LABELS... AND THE EUCHARIST?

If you've taken any number of medications, you know that so many of them have very specific instructions attached to them. "Take with food." "Take in the morning." "Do not drink alcohol while taking." "Do not drive." There are several instructions that can be attached, and the purpose of any of these instructions is simple: the doctors want the medicine to be maximally effective, without causing as many, if any, very detrimental side effects.

Jesus gives a simple reminder to the crowds in the Gospel passage selected for this weekend: "Your ancestors ate manna, and they died. This is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die." He draws out a very real comparison between the "bread from heaven" that was the manna, and this new Bread from Heaven, that is the holy Eucharist. He reminds the crowds that the ones who eat this will live - and not just now, but forever! This must be some very potent medication, in a manner of speaking.

Indeed- this is a medication with very potent strength- but only if we receive it correctly. We all know about the need to fast an hour before Mass. What about the need to receive it worthily? The Church makes it clear that she expects us to present ourselves for communion only if our souls are in a state to receive our Lord. In short- the Church expects us to utilize reconciliation regularly before receiving our Lord so that our hearts and souls may be made ready to receive Him (Catechism 1385). We should make every effort to both know what the Church tells us is sinful (especially mortally so) and to surrender all these things to our Lord in reconciliation even before we approach the altar. We may still struggle, and may still be imperfect this side of heaven, but if we take the proper preparations to more worthily receive the Lord in the Eucharist, we may receive the full effect of what He gives us: the Bread of Life!


