THE EUCHARIST SHOWS US SACRIFICE

If you've ever heard the short story "The Gift of the Magi, it is a very simple Christmas story, and yet it is powerfully heartwarming. This story, in short, is about a couple, Jim and Della, who make great sacrifices for each other to get their spouse the best Christmas gift. Yet, when they each receive those gifts, they realize the other person has sacrificed the thing that their gift was supposed to ornament or enhance to get the gift for each other. It's a tale of sacrifice, and of profound true love.

We continue the Bread of Life discourse this weekend, and we reach a point where Jesus is now focusing on the fact that this Bread of Life is His Body, and the chalice is His Blood. This, of course, causes no small amount of scandal and controversy amongst the Jews that are present, but Jesus does not back down from His message. This is His Body and Blood. One must eat it to live. This emphasizes something that they did not understand their Savior loves them so much that He would hand over everything so that they might live and have life forever.

All too often, we are focused on consuming. We want to have and to take, and to focus upon ourselves. While that is an option for a way to live, it is not Jesus's way. Jesus's way is sacrifice. Jesus's way is pouring Himself out for those whom He loves. Jesus's way is handing over His Body for our salvation- and also for our life. He withholds nothing, but instead gives us this tremendous sacrifice of His Body and Blood. May we be so generous and sacrificial, for if the Master has handed over something so great, surely we can respond with sacrifices of our own, striving to sacrifice as well as Jim, as Della, or even trying to imitate Jesus's sacrifice for each other.


