#### WHERE JEALOUSLY AND ENVY BLIND

In my days at the seminary, there would often be times where we would have bishops, archbishops, or even an occasional cardinal visit the seminary. Often there was a task at hand, but many of us also had to laugh at the usual routine- many guys who wanted to be close to someone of rank would start trying to get their attention. For whatever reason they would be consumed with the "rat race" of seminary, and would forget all about the simple purpose they were often there- to help us see the Lord more clearly.

It's an absurd thing to think that while the disciples were going along the way to Capernaum, they were arguing amongst themselves trying to figure out who was the greatest. Jesus- the second Person of the Trinity- was in their midst and they became so consumed with themselves that they distracted themselves to His presence in their midst by arguing who was the greatest. Jesus gives them a reality check: "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." They shouldn't argue about who is first, but who is last? What this means, in short, is that the one who is most like Christ- even as He is the Suffering Servant- is the one who is truly the greatest.

Today, there are too many distractions to name that try to take our focus off Jesus. One of the worst for us still is jealousy and envy- we want to appear first in the eyes of the world and the eyes of men. However- it should not be so amongst us. If we truly aspire to greatness- and a greatness that will not fade- we will commit ourselves to being near Christ each and every day.

We don't need to be acknowledged by someone of high rank, and we don't need to fight others to be first. Let us be content with being near the Master- and being the last of all, and the servant of all.


