"GO YOUR WAY"

As much fun as goats and sheep could be back home, there was a perpetual problem with them: they had a propensity for getting stuck in fences. It was something we always had to watch for, because if they did get stuck, there was often little they could do. So, we'd have to go and wrangle with them and the fence until finally- they can finally "go their way!" We'd pop them out and they would happily bolt back to the flock. If there ever was a possible expression of joy from those sheep and goats, we'd certainly see it as they were halfway back to the fold.

Jesus and Bartimaeus have a very similar encounter in the Gospel this weekend. Bartimaeus has been blind and wants healing. Even as others are rebuking him and telling him to be silent, he still calls out and wants to see. He knows and believes that Jesus can restore his sight. That faith is eventually rewarded: Jesus heals Bartimaeus, and then Bartimaeus, we are told, follows Jesus along the way. Jesus reminds him in the moment of healing his faith saved him now he is free to move about and go!


Though we may not necessarily struggle with physical blindness, we do have plenty of things that could cause us to come before the Lord, asking for His pity and mercy, because they snare and trap us. Perhaps it is in our sufferings, as we spoke of last week, or perhaps there are infirmities within our soul. Maybe there is a battle with sin. Maybe it's one of many possibilities: impurity, gossip, lying, worrying, selfishness, greediness, anger, amongst many, many other sins. Each of these are areas where we may struggle- but we need not remain snared in them. If we vulnerably seek out Jesus in these places, in confession, and in our prayer, Jesus can give us the ability to "go your way" in freedom!


